

LRSP Results

25%

reduction in county road fatalities in Minnesota.

17%

reduction in fatal and serious injury crashes on county-owned roads in Washington State.

35%

reduction in severe curve crashes in Thurston County, WA.

Data-driven, actionable framework to reduce roadway deaths

LOCAL

Focus on crashes along county and municipal public roads

SAFETY

Reduce fatalities and serious injuries for all road users by targeting common crash attributes

ACTION

Develop comprehensive strategies with actions

PLAN

Prepare document of priorities, implementation, and evaluation





Free direct technical assistance to complete a specific CS task to advance the NJTPA's LRTP goals.











Competitive program for municipalities


Projects may integrate arts, culture, and other community assets















COMPLETE STREETS DEMONSTRATION LIBRARY

Program to assist communities test out Complete Streets and safety improvements to their roadways

Projects can vary widely in size and duration, from a one-day parklet in a single parking stall to a multi-block bike lane lasting several months.


Materials are provided for **free** for communities to borrow. Pick up/drop off of materials is with Hudson TMA in Jersey City
